• **District / SES Bond Work:**

- Update on Bond Work and Innovation funds  
Officially in the bond and ready for construction. Will be messy, inconvenient, and frustrating. Be patient! Will be amazing when finished. Communication will be very important-will be updated weekly for parents. Will impact pick-up and drop-off  
Biggest inconvenience is the green fence that eliminates the circle drive for pick-up and drop off. Big school busses will pick-up in front of green fence closer to North Pool. All buses will drop off at same location, behind green fence. Will have temporary kindergarten playground. Circle drive will be gone forever. New bus drop-off and pick-up locations will be permanent. Still hug and go in morning, but not in afternoon when small buses are picking up. Parent drop off will remain the same.  
Will be very noisy resulting in moving AIM program. Will be moved to the teacher lounge. Will be a temporary wall to keep them out of the work room. They will have sinks, bathrooms, and refrigerator.  
Kindergarten playground will not be available.
- Start date: March 2019  
Want to involve students in the construction process.  
\*Make a poster of finished product  
New more controlled entrance into building  
Predicted finished date will be 8/8  
Adding rooms for preschool and AIM program so will have room for 3 full day kinders in present AIM room.  
Will move structure and sand box for kinder playground  
Only keeping 2 modulars on site for afterschool activities  
Contractors work 7-7

Innovation funds= \$200,000. Classrooms working with BCI for new furniture. Each classroom will have a budget. Order in by 3/1 so furniture will be here in August. Library will have a budget as well  
Approved for painting and carpet throughout building and new chiller installed. New grey based color scheme
